I feel such pride in our home Town of Collingwood. I am proud to live here. I am proud that my family enjoys life in Collingwood.

I know we as a Council we are feeling real excitement and a total commitment to building a stronger, more vibrant community for the future generations.

The challenges that lie ahead are many: our collective abilities to address these challenges are strong: the opportunities that will be realized from our efforts are great.

We will continue to grow a community in which our children and grandchildren can be proud.

JFK once said: "Ask not what your country can do for you but rather what can you do for your country". The people of Collingwood have lived this statement for one hundred and fifty two years, and it continues today.

We see it in the founding families who built our Town out of wilderness, in the Shipbuilders that carried our name around the world.

Clearly the men and women that own, operate and work in our many wonderful restaurants have a much better understanding of where their patrons would prefer to sit. Too much time and too many words have been spent on this issue.

As a fourth step, I will ask your Council to review our current approach to working with industry in our community. A sustainable economy must have good paying, full-time jobs that support families, mortgages and education, yes and taxes. Our Council must create an environment where private business and industry thrives through new technologies. My pledge to those in industry and small business is that our Team will make it happen.

The needs of our residents are many and varied. We do need to operate in a spirit of financial prudence. We will need to encourage and examine alliances and partnerships the likes that have never been contemplated in the past. In short, our Team, your Council is going to have to think outside the box.

My promise is simple and straight forward, I will give our community every ounce of positive energy I can muster, I will work with my fellow Councillors in an open, positive and engaging manner, I will make decisions in the same way you would because at the end of the day we all aspire to the same, a stronger, more vibrant and united community.
